

On behalf of the ǰá'isla Nation, I extend a heartfelt welcome to our lands. For thousands of years, our people have thrived in this area. Today, about 700 of our 2,000+ members live in our main community, ǰá'isla (formerly Kitamaat Village), with many more across B.C. and beyond.

It is with great pride and gratitude that I invite you to explore the lands, waters, and stories that define our territory. As the elected Chief Councillor, I am honoured to represent a people whose roots run deep in this territory, whose traditions, language, and values continue to guide us forward.

As you explore the area, I invite you to experience the beauty of our territory. A simple itinerary would be to visit our ǰá'isla community with a stop at our Health Centre building, where a stunning display of artwork greets you at the entrance. This vibrant installation features contributions from five talented ǰá'isla artists - Paul Windsor, Brad Starr, the late Barry Wilson, and Nathan Wilson - framing a majestic totem pole carved by the late Sammy Robinson, which stands proudly at the centre. Next, treat yourself to a local favourite at Gizuá Market, our community store renowned for its delicious frozen yogurt. From there, take a leisurely walk down Haisla Avenue to our marina where a scenic boardwalk invites you to soak in the breathtaking views of the Douglas Channel. It's the perfect place to enjoy the ocean breeze and snap that picture-perfect moment for your social media feed.

We are proud to share ǰá'isla Nation is home to acclaimed author Eden Robinson, whose novel *Monkey Beach*, now a feature film, continues to share powerful Indigenous stories worldwide. We also celebrate the Snotty Nose Rez Kids, a Juno Award-winning hip-hop duo from our Nation whose music inspires Indigenous youth across the globe.

Whether you are here to experience our breathtaking landscapes, learn about our cultural heritage, or connect with the warmth of both communities, we are grateful you have chosen to visit. We hope your visit leaves you with lasting memories and a deeper appreciation for the beauty and resilience of our Nation. May your time here be filled with discovery, connection, and peace.

Welcome from the Mayor

Welcome to B.C.'s Marvel of Nature and Industry.

The District of Kitimat, located on the unceded territory of the Haisla Nation, is a community that captures the charms of a small town with the opportunity to enjoy world-class outdoor recreation and high-end local amenities.

As you read through this guide, you'll quickly be introduced to what makes this community so great and unique.

Our municipal recreational facilities provide indoor opportunities from swimming at our Sam Lindsay Aquatic Centre, to skating at Tamitik Arena, to fitness opportunities at the Riverlodge Recreation Centre.

An abundance of outdoor trails, including recently developed mountain bike trails to connect you with our forests.

Access to the Douglas Channel, a saltwater fjord with even more to explore by boat.

While enjoying the local amenities be sure to spend time at our newest nature park, Minette Bay West Park. Located directly next to the water, there is a leisurely trail, fire pits, a covered seating area overlooking the ocean and a recently installed floating dock where you can launch your kayak or canoe.

A new, beautifully carved pole stands next to the recently constructed Haisla Bridge. The pole, in a small park space, stands over a view of the Kitimat River with walking connections to our nearby municipal campground.

Speaking of camping, if you're a camper you have local options to stay during the summer either at Radley Park, the only campsite along the Kitimat River, or at nearby Hirsch Creek Park, a more rustic and nature-based camping experience.

What really stands us apart, though, is how unlike many other towns we are. We are a purposefully built community designed with plenty of green space, many neighbourhood playgrounds, and an elaborate walkway system to connect it all together.

I also encourage you to spend time learning about the community such as with a visit to the local Kitimat Museum & Archives. There is a lot you can learn there about our town's history, the Haisla Nation, and wildlife. It is also home to the local art gallery.

Visiting and living in Kitimat is an adventure and we hope that you enjoy your time and your journey through our community.

Haisla Nation

The ǰá'isla Nation is in a period of deep and rewarding self-discovery, embracing its cultural and language roots while uncovering evidence of its long and storied past in this valley.

The ǰá'isla People have lived in this territory for thousands of years. That rich history came to life in the summer of 2020 when, during environmental restoration work in Minette Bay, ǰá'isla and their industrial partners uncovered ancient ǰá'isla fishing weirs.

Radiocarbon dating revealed that these weirs were built and used as early as 1,800 years ago—a remarkable discovery that offers a glimpse into ǰá'isla ingenuity and connection to the land and waters.

Since then, much has changed in the valley, impacting the ǰá'isla in many ways. In 1918, the influenza pandemic drastically reduced the population, and like many Indigenous Nations across Canada, the ǰá'isla continue to feel the lasting impacts of the Indian Residential School system and its ongoing legacy.

Today's ǰá'isla Nation is an amalgamation of the ǰenáksiala (Kemano and Kitlope) and the ǰá'isla (Kitamaat) Peoples.

The ǰá'isla social system is based on matrilineal clans, each with their own himáas (chiefs) and músmezit (matriarchs). The present-day clans are Beaver, Raven, Eagle, and Killer Whale/Black Fish/Salmon. Historically, there were also the Crow, Frog, and Wolf clans, which later merged with others due to declining numbers.

In the early 21st century, conversations with project proponents ushered in a new era of development and inclusion, ensuring the ǰá'isla Nation has both a Share and Say in what is built—and how it is built—within their territory.

This new wave of opportunity has brought increased employment for ǰá'isla members and strengthened the Nation's vision of economic independence, most notably through the ǰá'isla-led Cedar LNG project.

The summer of 2025 marked another historic moment as the first LNG tanker arrived in the Kitimat Valley to transport natural gas—symbolizing both the Nation's evolving role in regional development and its continued leadership in shaping the future of its lands and resources.

That same year, in the fall of 2025, the community witnessed an extraordinary act of reMatriation when Elysia Poon and her team from the School for Advanced Research returned home a ceremonial mask carved by Joe Bolton. The event was a powerful moment of reconnection and healing, bringing a treasured piece of ǰá'isla artistry and spirit back to its rightful place.

At the same time, the ǰá'isla Culture & Language Department continues vital work in preserving and revitalizing ǰá'isla history, language, and nuyem—the collection of Haisla stories, teachings, and laws that guide community life.

While Kitamaat is the Tsimshian word for “People of the Snow”, the Haisla name for Kitamaat Village is “ǰimáuǰa”, meaning “Snag Beach”.

About Us

Kitimat is on the traditional and unceded territory of the Haisla Nation. The community was created to serve the industry in the 1950s and attracted workers from around the world. Kitimat has twice been the site of Canada's largest-ever private investment.

History

Kitimat was considered the “place to be” in North America in the 1950s, both for the new town plan, which was considered revolutionary and for its pioneer engineering feats.

During the post-war industrial boom, the Kitimat Project was the largest construction project of the time. A model of modern Canadian ingenuity, as the country's wild landscape, was surmounted with Kitimat's construction – from scratch. Records were set, there was innovation at every turn, and the result was the largest smelter in the world and a premier community to go with it.

The provincial and federal governments, along with the Aluminum Company of Canada, promoted Kitimat around the world. The community was designed for the worker and their families. The fulfillment of the residents' needs as the focus of a town plan was revolutionary.

The plant officially opened on August 3, 1954, with His Royal Highness Prince Philip, Duke of Edinburgh, tapping the first ingot.

Kitimat Project

Kitimat was built to support the construction and operation of the new industry-leading Alcan aluminum smelter in the 1950s.

The massive Kitimat Project was completed in just five years and included a dam, tunnel, powerhouse, transmission line, smelter, and Kitimat – British Columbia's first planned community.

The community was designed by renowned city planner Clarence Stein to facilitate an environment that would attract and retain workers.

Multiculturalism in Kitimat

Kitimat enjoyed a strong multicultural community spirit from early on, which continues to this day. There was a popular saying in the old days: “If you want to study a foreign language, go stand at the bus stop.”

While provincial and federal governments, along with Alcan (formerly the Aluminum Company of Canada), promoted Kitimat around the world – Alcan also hired across the prairies and in major centres using radio, television and industry press, attracting both English and French-speaking Canadians. Community groups formed as new residents hailed from Italy, Portugal, Greece, India, China, the Philippines, Finland and elsewhere.

Be sure to check out Heritage Park! Home to a variety of flags from all over the world representing many of the different multicultural groups that reside in Kitimat.

Our Parks

The Kitimat Region is home to many coastal parks, protected areas, and heritage conservancies. Some you can get to by land, others are more remote and accessible only by water.

There are park spaces suitable for all members of the family, including outdoor wading pools and green spaces, skateboard and bike parks, along with many playgrounds throughout town!

Coghlin Park

Located on Haisla Boulevard, this scenic lookout provides spectacular views of the Douglas Channel from the manicured gardens of Coghlin and Kemano Parks. Gazing down the channel you may catch a glimpse of large ships coming in to the industrial docks or one of the many smaller recreational boats dotting the water. To the east you will see the calm waters of Minette Bay and the islands and coastal mountains provide a breathtaking backdrop to the view.

Heritage Park

Heritage Park is located outside of the Kitimat Chamber of Commerce and Visitor Centre. The park is home to a variety of flags from all over the world, representing many of the multicultural groups who reside in Kitimat. Visitors will also find benches, picnic tables, an information kiosk, covered gazebo, and our Spirit Bear decorated with First Nations artwork. An amphitheatre to host arts and cultural events was built in 2020, sponsored by the District of Kitimat, DCH Industries, and Northern Development Initiative Trust. It's a perfect area for an afternoon picnic or rest stop.

Centennial Park

Centennial Park was built in 1971 to commemorate the 100th anniversary of British Columbia's entry into Confederation. The Park boasts beautiful flower gardens, picnic tables, benches, a cenotaph war memorial, water fountain and totem pole. The totem pole depicts the story of Hunclee Qualaas or Waamis and the founding of Kitimat. The top figure is Waamis and below him are the legendary monsters that inhabited the Kitimat Valley. The park is a great place to enjoy a picnic or a leisurely stroll around the beautiful gardens. Centennial Park is located in City Centre across from Upper City Centre Mall.

Lion's Park

Lions Park is a popular destination for families looking for outdoor fun in the sun. The park boasts a well-equipped playground, picnic tables and beautiful manicured gardens.

Located near the entrance of the Tamitik Recreation Complex, Lions Park is the perfect place to have a picnic after a swim or a day of shopping!

Minette Bay West Park

Minette Bay West Park is Kitimat's newest park space and the only municipal park located directly along the shores of the Douglas Channel at the Kitimat Arm.

The park boasts fire pits, a leisurely trail easy for all ages, seating, toilets, and a special covered seating area with a view straight down the channel. It now also features a floating dock to launch non-motorized boats or to just sit and enjoy the saltwater.

Minette Bay West Park is recognized by the Stewardship Centre for B.C. as being the first park in the province to incorporate Green Shores planning principles from the outset.

Reaching the park by car is easy, follow the signs from City Centre to Loganberry Street. Directional signs will indicate the way.



Giant Spruce Park

Sitka Spruce commonly grow up to 70m tall and 2m across when mature. Giant Spruce Park is located on the shores of the Kitimat River flood plain. The remains of the previously registered “largest living Sitka Spruce in BC” can be found in the park. The tree measures 11.2m in circumference (36.7ft) and once stood 50.32m tall (165ft). As you walk the trail of this park you will notice the forest floor is thick with moss, ferns, and blueberry bushes.

Adventure Parks

Kitimat offers a wide range of park facilities including a challenging skate, bike and board park. Accessible equipment is available at a number of these parks while others include wide open green spaces. The community is uniquely connected with a series of paths through green spaces to eliminate excessive crossing of major streets. During summer months access is available to wading pools operated by the District of Kitimat.

Kitimat Dog Park

Let Fido exercise and play off-leash in a controlled environment under your supervision. The fenced dog park allows owners and their dogs to spend time together and offers your dog(s) a space to play and companionship with others. The dog park offers agility obstacles and fresh water for dogs. Located on Kuldo Boulevard. Please clean up after your dog - bags and garbage containers are provided at the park. Other off-leash areas include Dyke Road and Forest Avenue.

Radley Park

A campers' mecca in the heart of great fishing country, Radley Park is a 38-unit campground situated on the western bank of the Kitimat River. Only minutes from downtown Kitimat, Radley Park is an ideal summer getaway.

Adventurous campers can take advantage of the many recreational opportunities available on the Kitimat River, including trout and salmon fishing, canoeing, kayaking, and class-two white water rafting.

Radley Park also has picnic tables as well as a shelter with a barbeque and tables.

Hirsch Creek Park

This scenic park is located at the entrance to Kitimat on Highway 37S. Hirsch Creek Park is convenient to town and features numerous picnic sites along the riverbank, a sheltered barbeque area, dry toilets, and seven campsites. A beautiful spot for fishing and hiking, Hirsch Creek Park is perfect for the whole family and for those who would like to “get away”. A stroll through the old growth forest is a relaxing and renewing experience.

The park has a 9-hole disc golf course with a beginner-friendly RED layout and a longer BLUE layout for those wanting an extra challenge, play both to get a full 18 holes in. Discs are available for rent or purchase through the District of Kitimat's Leisure Services at the Riverlodge Recreation Centre.

Oviatt Bike Park

Generously funded and developed by Jack and Debbie Oviatt, a new community Skills Course and Bike Pump Track is now fully functional and open in Kitimat!

This project boasts several fun elements, including: a pump track, half pipe element, progressive drops, dirt jumps, wooden obstacles, kids track, and much more. The park spans across several acres in the Strawberry Meadows area of the community and is just a few minutes from the City Centre.

Whale Watching

The Douglas Channel is one of the widest and deepest waterways on the west coast and a perfect place for whales to thrive thanks to rich food sources, quiet waters and deep fjords.

Seeing multiple pods of killer whales and/or humpbacks (depending on the season!) when out fishing or on a boat tour is standard in Kitimat. There are not many places in the world where you can say the same!

Killer Whales - The iconic orcas of the Eastern Pacific arrive in Kitimat in June, just in time to feed off salmon running into the Kitimat River.

Humpback Whales - Humpback whales begin their migration in early spring and arrive in August. Their preferred source of food in Kitimat is herring, in addition to krill and other small fish such as mackerel.

The wildlife that inhabit the Kitimat area are spectacular and the Douglas Channel is home to marine mammals both large and small. While you're out whale watching in Kitimat – see if you can also spot harbour porpoises, pacific white-sided dolphins in the water, the Kermode bear or grizzlies on the land from the boat, or majestic bald eagles in the sky!

Jesse Falls

Jesse Falls is a 10-metre-high freshwater waterfall that drains directly out of Jesse Lake and into the ocean. Only accessible by boat.

Hot Springs

Kitimat's wild marine hot springs are natural and sulphur-free. What else could be better than mother nature's hot tub surrounded by spectacular views? These hot springs are only accessible by boat.

Bishop Bay Hot Springs

Hot springs at Bishop Bay come out of the ground from a crevice in the granodiorite bedrock right beside the bath house.

Water temperature at the bath house is about 38.8 degrees Celsius.

Coordinates: N 53° 28' 11.89", W 128° 50' 11.85"

Shearwater Hot Springs

Shearwater Hot Springs are also known as Europa Hot Springs. The hot springs and bath house are located along the north shore of a small bay between Shearwater Point and Europa Point.

Water comes from cracks in the bedrock at the bottom of the hot springs and its temperature at the bathhouse is about 40.6 degrees Celsius.

Weewanie Hot Springs


Weewanie Hot Springs is nestled in a semi-sheltered bay. There is a bath house for soaking.

Water comes out of the ground on the hillside above the bath house and its temperature is about 38.6 degrees Celsius in the bath house.

Take it all in

It's no secret that world-class salt and freshwater fishing and backcountry adventures are what Kitimat is known for, but that's not all we've got! Whether you want to be indoors or out, active or a spectator, and regardless of age and ability levels – Kitimat has exciting attractions!



Hospital Beach

This ocean-side beach (the original site of Kitimat's first hospital) is located just past Rio Tinto's BC Works smelter. It is a popular gathering spot for visitors and locals during the summer months. At low tide, you can explore and may find seashells and other small sea creatures.

Gazebo Trail

Take this short trail to one of Kitimat's best kept secrets: a gazebo overlooking the ocean. Easily accessible on foot (for kids, too!) and located close to both Kitimaat Village and MK Bay Marina. Pack a lunch and take in the views!

Moore Creek Falls

Located just across from Rio Tinto's BC Works main office building, Moore Creek Falls is a photographer's delight. As you climb the rugged stairs carved into the hillside, the sound of snowmelt water rushing over the rocks leaves you anticipating what's ahead.

Kitimat Fish Hatchery

The Kitimat Hatchery is operated by the Federal Department of Fisheries and Oceans Canada. The species mix includes chinook salmon, chum salmon, coho salmon, steelhead and cutthroat trout. The hatchery is wheelchair accessible and open Monday to Friday during the summer. Please call ahead for availability of tours.

"Bridging Our Nuyem" Totem Pole

Carved by Nathan Wilson, the figures in the pole from top to bottom, are a trapper holding a marten – this was one of the most important fur bearing animals that was trapped and the pole is on a traditional wawáís. The next figures are a Grizzly bear holding a salmon and a diving eagle with a salmon in its talons. On the very bottom are the key stone species that have sustained the Haisla, the salmon and oolichan.

Minette Bay West Park

Minette Bay West is a newly created nature park in Kitimat, located directly on the shoreline at Minette Bay. With a forested trail, covered seating overlooking the Douglas Channel, and plentiful fire pits, this is a wonderful new location to bring your family for the day or for some after-work relaxation.

For a shortcut, from Forest Ave. continue onto South Hirsch forestry road for about 3.5 km, then turn left onto a 4WD road and follow to parking. Travel straight (west) along the trail.

Access via Hirsch Creek South (2): Continue following the south side of the creek after crossing to the east side of HWY 37. Continue straight (east) at the fork, do not cross the bridge.

Access via Hirsch Creek North (3): Follow the trail until you reach an old logging bridge, cross and continue to follow the trail to your left (east) at the fork.

10. Clague Mountain - giyuyua

11. Mount Elizabeth - láaḡakas

Description: Mount Elizabeth is a challenging trail and is only recommended for experienced hikers. The lookout is located in sub-alpine and takes approx. 2-2.5hrs to hike up to but provides a great view of Kitimat. You can continue to Little Elizabeth, which is another 2 hrs from the lookout, while the summit is another 1-1.5hrs additional hiking from Little Elizabeth. The last half of the hike is a very difficult trail of loose rocks and can be covered by patches of snow.

Directions: Drive north from the Kitimat Chamber of Commerce building along Highway 37, for about 7.5 km. Turn right just south from where the Hydro transmission lines cross the Highway and follow the North Hirsch Mainline for 13.5 km. From this point you may turn left onto a rough narrow 4WD road for the next 2.5 km. to the reach the trailhead.

NOTE: If your vehicle is not equipped for very rough, narrow, and steep terrain do not attempt to drive to the trailhead. Park at the access point and walk. There are dips in the road that a pickup truck may get stuck in without sufficient ground clearance.

13. Robinson Ridge - semgás, zeḡwís

Description: From the end of the road this trail climbs steeply up the west side of the ridge, through heavy timber, into the sub alpine and then continues south along the ridge to a rustic cabin. The trail is primarily a winter snowmobile route, as a result hikers will encounter wet areas and steep sections. There are excellent views of the surrounding mountain ranges from the trail.

Directions: From the Kitimat Chamber of Commerce office, located on Highway 37, head east along Forest Avenue and the South Hirsch forestry road for approximately 7.5 km. At this point (Branch 100) turn right and the road begins to climb towards the south. After another 4 km the trailhead is reached. Sections of the road are rough and require 4WD.

Watch for Wildlife! As you experience the salt spray and ocean wind, be on the lookout for sea lions, eagles, orcas, humpback whales and dolphins at play. You may even spot the elusive Kermode bear exploring the shores of the Douglas Channel or bald eagles as they pick salmon, or dolphins swimming alongside your boat.

Some of the largest halibut on the BC coast are found in the protected waters of the Inside Passage. Dungeness crab, snapper, and prawns can be found as well!

Kitimat's location at the head of the Douglas Channel - one of BC's longest inland fjords provides access to unbelievable saltwater fishing adventures. The Kitimat River and many more feeder creeks and rivers produce migrating salmon along this 90 km stretch of ocean to the Inside Passage.

Enjoy some of the world's best fly fishing in the pristine Kitimat wilderness or, for the more adventurous, try the many remote fly-in areas that provide spectacular scenery and tranquility.

Kitimat River has plenty of fish stocks 12 months of the year with some of the finest steelhead, salmon, and trout fishing in British Columbia!

Rivers in Northwest BC have their own personalities and fishing the meandering Kitimat River offers a unique, quiet serenity and a much needed change of pace. Spring is when steelhead are abundant, which average 8 to 12 pounds. A little later in the season and through the summer the powerful chinook salmon get up to 40 pounds

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Snowshoeing

Snowshoe on Clague Mountain Trail. There are routes for everyone, from novice to more experienced. Cabin users need a membership with the Snowmobile & Hikers Club.

Snowshoeing is a great winter activity for the whole family and is one of the easiest and least expensive ways to exercise and/or get out and enjoy the snow. If you enjoy hiking, then you will love exploring the marked trails in winter too and possibly spot some wildlife along the way.

At Onion Lake from Snow Valley Nordic Ski Club Snowshoe passes are available in the ticket booth at the front gate entrance. Snowshoe rentals are available on weekends when the rental shed is open: Saturdays 10-4, Sundays 11-4.

Backcountry Skiing

Kitimat locals love the convenience of having amazing backcountry ski access right at their doorsteps.

If you're a visitor, you'll enjoy easy access to the stunning, endless backcountry of the Kitimat Ranges.

Be sure to plan ahead, and consider getting or upgrading your avalanche skills training.

Cross-Country Skiing

About halfway between Kitimat and Terrace are 35km of groomed trails perfect for both cross-country and skate skiing. These are called the Onion Lake Ski Trails, which are maintained by the Snow Valley Nordic Ski Club.

The ski trails were built to suit a variety of skill levels while providing easy access to the small lakes and spectacular views of the valley. The vistas of the Kitimat Range Coast Mountains that surround the trails make skiing an awe-inspiring experience.

- Day passes available for purchase from the ticket booth at the trailhead.
- Lessons are available for beginners.
- Ski and gear rentals available.
- 5km of lit trails for night skiing.
- 6km "Doggy Trail" dedicated to dog owners and their best friends.
- A warming hut, parking and toilets are available next to the stadium free of charge for season pass holders and day users.
